Stony Brook Aug 22<sup>nd</sup> 1888

At the Annual Meeting of School District No 1 Town of Brookhaven County of Suffolk held in the School House on Tuesday Evening August 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting called to order with A. H. Mills Chairman. The minutes of the last annual meeting read and approved by the meeting. The Trustees Report was read and approved. The Collectors Report was approved with a balance of \$146.26 to the District. The Committee on the Division of the two Districts failed to accomplish any thing on account of the Commissioner failed to keep his promises. It was voted that Mr Darling be appointed a Committee to deal with the Trustee and give the Commissioner one more chance to act. And if they will not do it to take it to the State Superintendent. The officers elected Samuel Powell Trustee, Chas. S. Hawkins Clerk, it was voted that the Teacher be Librarian, Lorenzo Mills Collector. It was voted that the Teachers wages and incidental expenses be left to the discretion of the Trustee. And that the Trustee notify the coming Teacher not to have any more pupils in the recitation Room than it can comfortably seat. The Rev. J. M. Hallock gave some very interesting remarks on school Teaching. Also Mr Mills told us how they taught school when he was a boy, when the birch rods stood in the corner for use. Meeting adjourned.

Mr Peterson objected on the ground that they Prohibitors were there in the Near Future as New Union School House would be built and thus the new Cistern would be money needlessly expended as the New House would necessarily require a new Cistern. Mrs Washington feared objected to the Prohibitors coming after Water and a compromise was suggested and the new Cistern had no votes.

Aug 7<sup>th</sup> The Annual School Meeting was held in the School House in Dist No. 1, Town of Brookhaven on Tuesday evening Aug 7<sup>th</sup> 1894 at 8 P.M.

The Meeting was called to order by the Clerk Mr. Thomas J. Kelly appointed Chairman. The Minutes of the last meeting<sup>1893</sup> were read and approved with the exception of the date which was corrected. The Report of the Trustee was then called for Mr. C. W. Peterson (Trustee) then reported that by some error in totaling the full amount of \$700 voted for was not collected but instead \$685.75. The Books had been balanced and there remained in the hands of the Collector \$97.88 Dollars after all bills paid.

The amount of free money received from the State was \$284.58 Children in the district of School age 113 Vouchers would be furnished if called for.

The C. C. Merrill Collector reported Balance on hand same as stated by Trustee but no financial Report. Report of Trustee and Collector accepted.

There were some differences of opinion in regard to legal matters by the Chairman & Trustee but were compromised satisfactorily after which the meeting proceeded to elect its officers

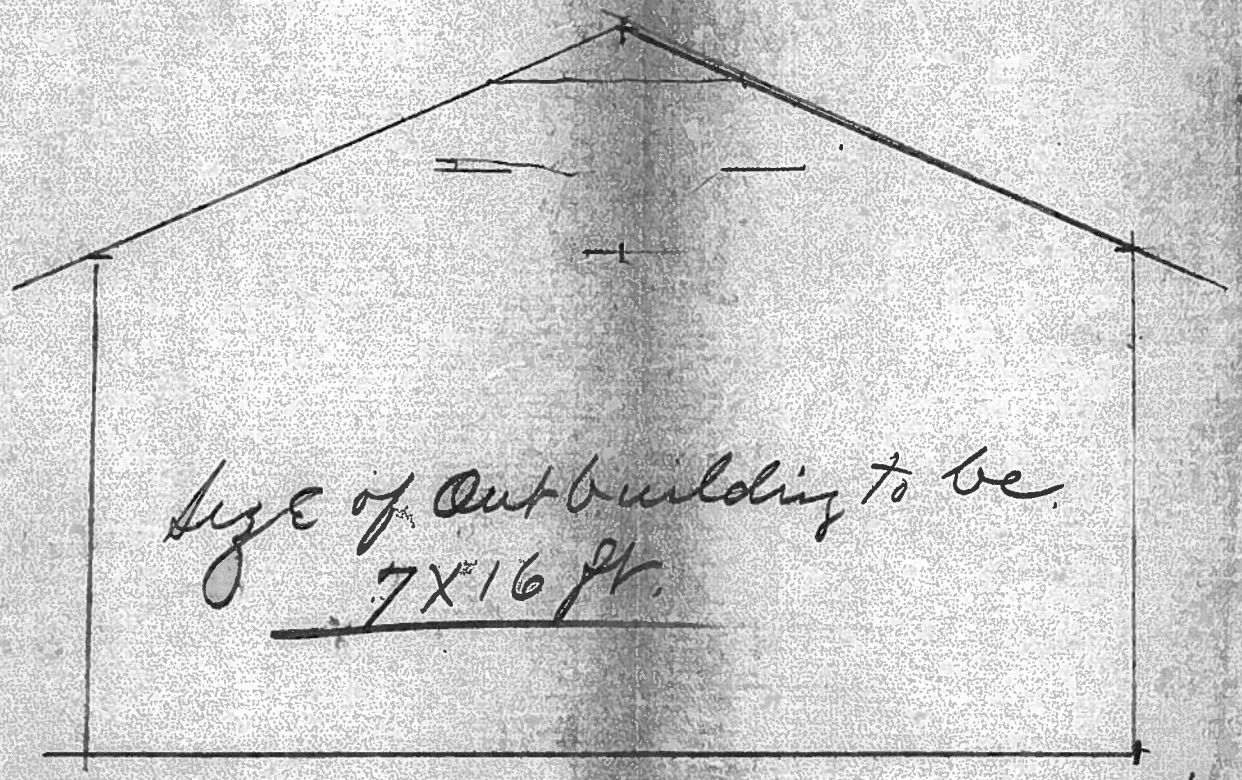
